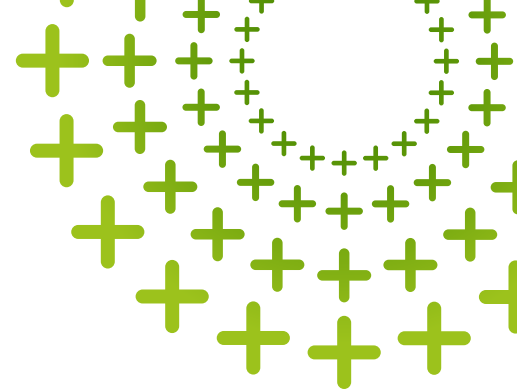

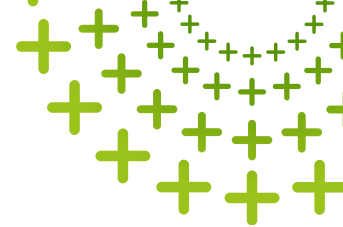
First plenary session | Clean air as care: Tackling air pollution around the hospital

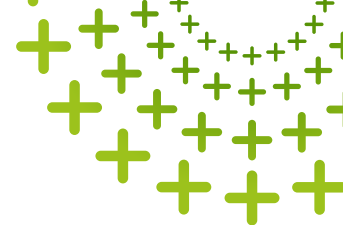

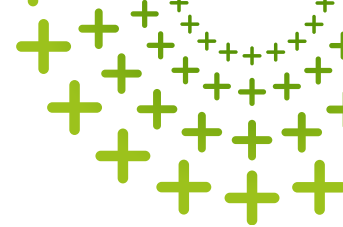
Small voice, big impact: Empowering children and young people to shape sustainable healthcare

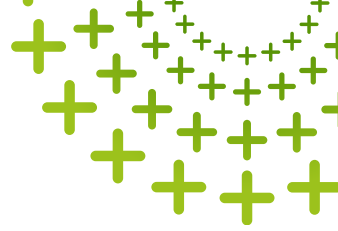
Fifth plenary session | Sustainability in clinical practice: Building knowledge through everyday action
